Three factors have contributed to this post-war development. First, a generation of architects trained in schools that do not teach traditional styles has now begun to practice. Second, architects like Frank Lloyd Wright and Mies van der Rohe, whose work was first exhibited by the Museum twenty years ago, are now finding commissions worthy of their talents. Third, government and industry—most notably our giant corporations—have at last become patrons of modern architecture. With the mid-centry modern architecture has come of age.

The 43 buildings (by 32 architects)... include office buildings, schools and houses, a hospital and a factory, a chapel and a boiler plant. All of them have been selected for their significance in the developing story of architecture and for their quality as individual works of art."
