

Gentlemen:

Ever since reading in last month's Saturday Review about the current retrospective exhibition of Diane Arbus' photography I have felt that I ought to write to you, because I have a painting that I think could give added meaning to the exhibition.

Diane (then Nemerov) and I started going to New York's Ethical Culture School together at the age of five in September of 1928. There were about two dozen boys and two dozen girls in our class. One of the other girls was Phyllis (then Carton) Shapiro. The three of us graduated as classmates in June of 1940. Our class happenmed to be one in which we were unashamedly concerned about one another, and we were together so long that in some respects we may still understand one another better than we understand ourselves.

Diane became a sensitive and perceptive photographer. Phyllis became a sensitive and perceptive artist.

Visiting Phyllis' home in 1962 in California, I saw a painting that she had done which I immediately recognized as Diane.

It is a powerful, truthful, revealing and, in its way, beautiful work. It came about in an interesting manner, a description of which I have in writing from the artist.

It has not been shown since 1962 any place but in my home. I would not permanently part with it, but if you might be interested in showing it simultaneously with your exhibition of Diane's work, I would like others to be able to see Diane in the added light of the insights provided by this intense and interesting work. Please let me know if you would like to see it.
