You will recall that we spoke on the telephone about two weeks ago in reference to some plants that the Museum needs for an exhibition in November. I now have detailed information and would appreciate it if you would begin to grow the following which we will need on November 7, 1972: ~~we have agreed that you will take back the plants on the last day of the exhibition in January.~~

85 cherry tomato plants which should be 10 to 12 inches high on November 7th, and 70 lettuce plants, preferably variety lactuca sativa (L.) also to be 8 to 10 inches high on November 7.

If you do not have the variety mentioned, please use another type. What's important is that the lettuce be of a very green type and be a very hardy variety that will not be a problem in transplanting. The same is true of the tomatoes. I would appreciate it very much if you would call me at 956-2665 to confirm this. I also wonder if it would be possible for you to supply us with perlit. We need 7 cubic meters of the coarse grain variety.

Could you also please give me a price estimate when you telephone?

I suggest that you look into this.

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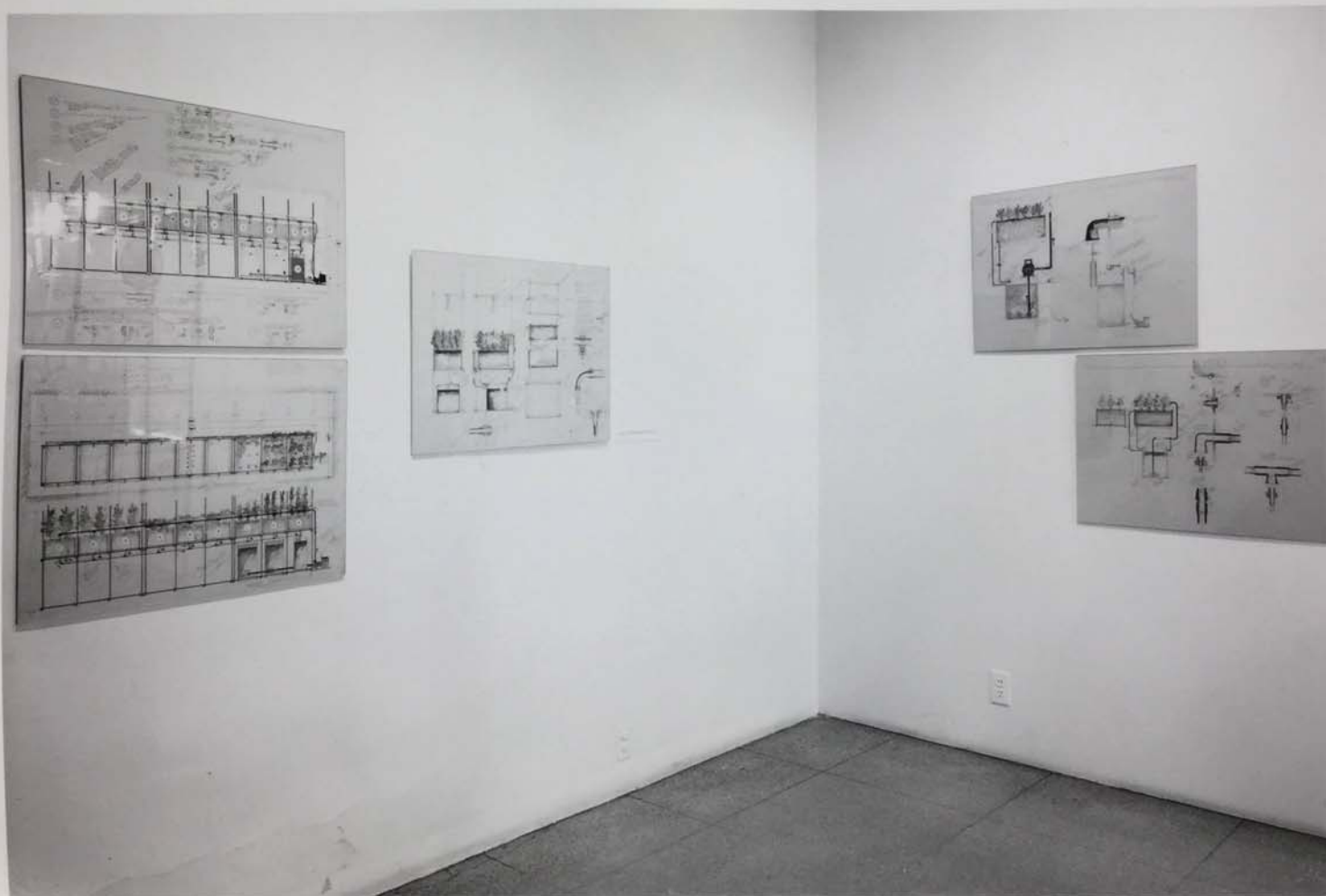
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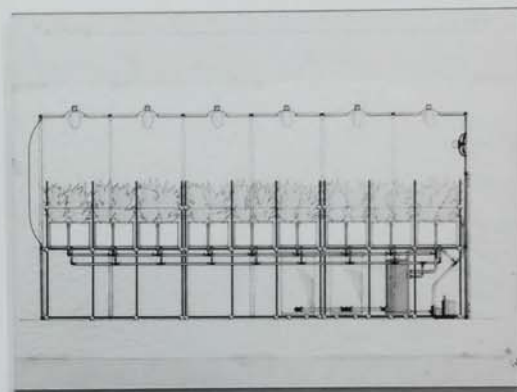
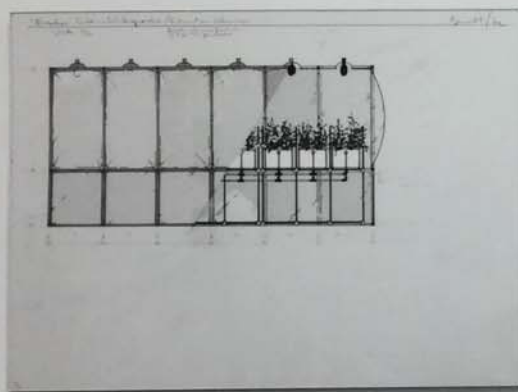
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
