MASTERPIECES OF ART

NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR 1940

The success of the Exhibition of Masterpieces of Art at the New York World's Fair 1939 was so great as to demand the continuation of the work this year. Not only did it vindicate anew the position of New York as a place where a World's Fair must contain an art exhibition, but the tens of thousands of visitors from the city, the country at large and from Europe were shown as never before the magnificent achievement of American art collecting. This may already be counted on as a powerful stimulus to the future development of our resources. But we must go on with the work, and the continuation of the Fair in 1940 gives us the opportunity to do so.

To duplicate the superb exhibition assembled by Dr. Valentiner would be impossible, and any attempt to repeat the impression of that assemblage of masterpieces which he gathered would be to invite comparisons sure to be prejudicial to the 1940 Exhibition. It will therefore depart from last year's precedent by omitting the work of the earlier centuries (perhaps best studied by the public in museums) by adding the art of the 19th Century and by including paintings by American artists of the 18th and 19th Centuries.

The history of art in this country must be seen in terms of the landmarks established by the expositions which have drawn our population to the cities where great showings of pictures were offered them. Thus the Centennial of 1876 and the Columbian Exposition of 1893 changed the whole character of American thinking on art.

Certainly you will wish to give your support to the coming exhibition which will prove, as did the 1939 Exhibition, a value to our people and the cause of art which only a long future will be able to estimate.

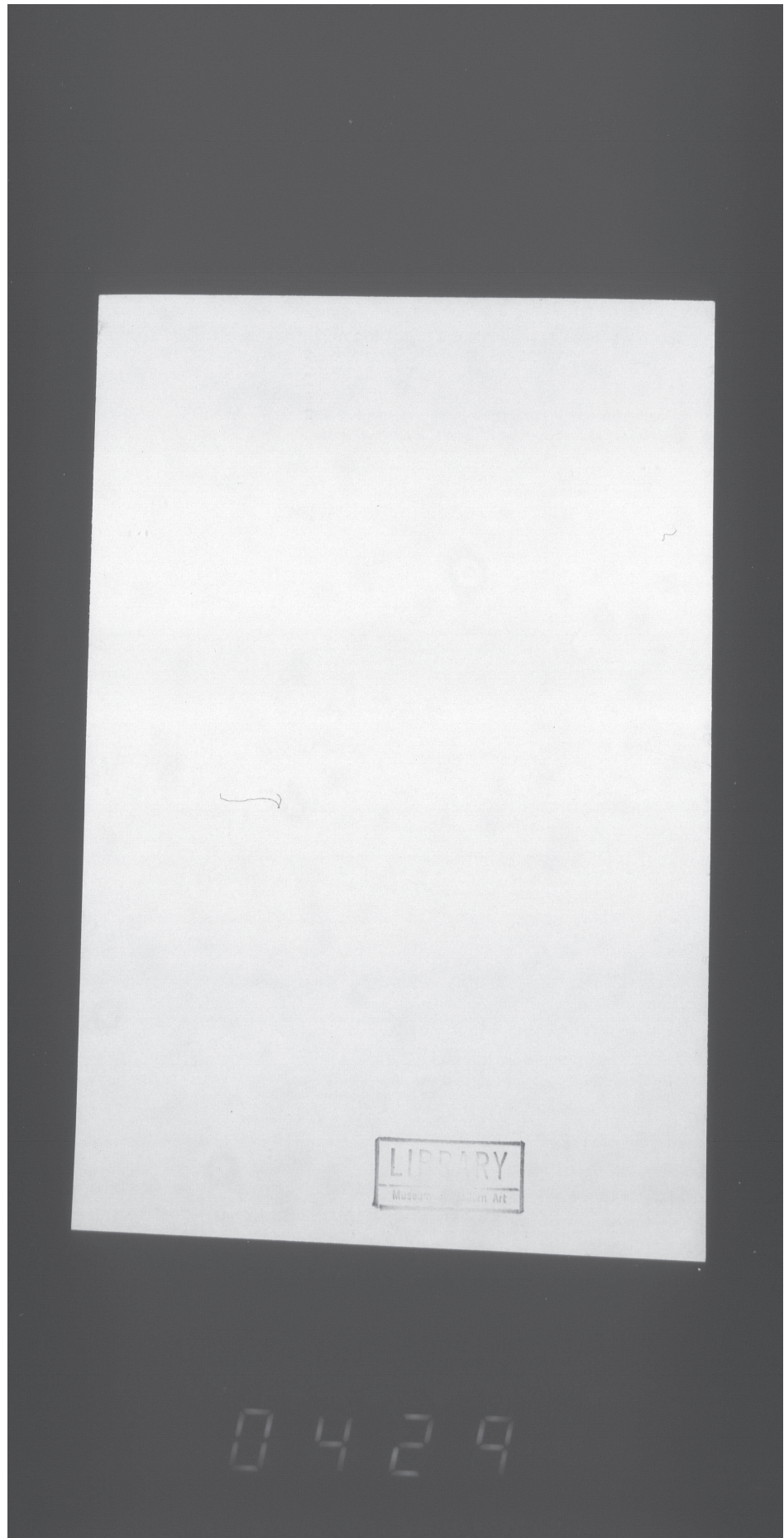
