

Dear Jackie Onassis,

It was a pleasure to see you once again at the Municipal Arts Society celebration for Philip Johnson which was held a little more than a year ago.

I am writing to you now because it would be lovely to see you in Montreal and frankly, I am also writing to ask you a favor: the favour of your visit.

We would love you to be the Guest of Honour at a cocktail party which is being held in May to celebrate the tenth anniversary of Héritage Montréal.

Héritage Montréal is the largest privately funded heritage organization in Canada. Like the Municipal Arts Society, we not only play an important leadership role in preservation in our nation's largest city but the impact of our programs goes far beyond municipal boundaries.

We have always had close relations with the Municipal Arts Society and feel that, in many ways, we are sister organizations. Margot Wellington was the Guest of Honour at our annual meeting several years ago and when we set up a public resource centre a few years ago, we called it 'Le centre urbain'.

I have enclosed an information kit on the foundation but let me mention some of the highlights:

- Heritage Montreal set up the Milton-Park project in which 600 homes were upgraded and transferred to the control of the former tenants; as the largest cooperative renovation project in North America, this \$31-million effort is a model response to the problem of displacement and gentrification.

- Héritage Montréal has, for the past five years, been running an important program of children's education on heritage and architecture, in cooperation with the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts;
- Héritage Montréal is running an important program of technical education aimed at encouraging professionals and the general public to renovation and in particular to respect the character of their buildings, as part of this program it runs the largest home renovation course on the continent, it is setting up a university level program of historic preservation, and it is publishing a series of consumer-oriented technical guides on renovation.

In addition, it operates an information centre, gives grants to local community groups, coordinates regular series of articles on architecture and renovation in local newspapers and carries on public advocacy on preservation and development issues.

All this is done on a shoe-string budget with a tiny staff.

Although much remains to be done, we feel that we have alot to celebrate about. We would be honoured to do this in your presence, as a leading advocate of historic preservation in the United States and as a representative of the Municipal Arts Society.

The event being planned is a cocktail party with several hundred of specially invited guests. It would be held in the early evening on a weekday in May. We would pick the date to accommodate your schedule. Once you have had an opportunity to digest this, I would welcome your call to discuss this further and to set a date convenient to you.

Maybe I can also entice you to visit the Centre Canadien d'Architecture/Canadian Centre for Architecture, the first museum and study centre on architecture in North America. I have enclosed our outdated brochure along with the material on Héritage Montréal.

I look forward to hearing from you soon.
