The first exhibition of the "Blue Four" took place at the Daniels Gallery in New York in 1925. In the following we are printing excerpts of letters to Galka Scheyer which preceded the exhibition.

LYONEL FEININGER. Weimar, January 13, 1924

... also I thank you very much for your two kind letters. I agree wholeheartedly to your suggestion of forming a union together with Jawlensky, Kandinsky and Klee. I am willing, if you want to. From my own experience I know that such a group as the "4"* would have a great suggestive power over our Americans, particularly the name "The 4," since for many decades a Railway Club has existed which is called the "Big Four," only, we would willingly forego the word "big." A group of 4 would be characteristic enough and in no way arrogant....

*So as to distinguish their group from another, similar one existing in America, as also to emphasize their similarity to the earlier group of artists called The Blue Knight (Der Blaue Reiter), the word "blue" was added.


... I think this idea very beautiful, if only the Big Three are not offended that I am among them....

WASSILY KANDINSKY. Weimar, January 17, 1924

... We—Feininger, Klee, I—have discussed the idea of the group of friends and suggest calling it the "Four," i.e., 4 friends or 4 comrades-in-arms—one can interpret it either way. As a whole characteristic and modest. All four of us are very different which I think, is rather an asset....

PAUL KLEE. Weimar, January 10, 1924

... on the other hand, it is perhaps well to distinguish by a name the solidarity of these works. There is no objection to this and it may even have a good effect over there; much as it would have here if the works of a group of unknown artists from the Orient were to be known by a characteristic name. Only, we are not certain what kind of name to choose. Under no circumstances should it end with an "ism" or "ists," but rather should combine and do justice to the fundamental character, the intellectual leadership or perhaps also that which is the finest about it, our friendship....




