

Thank you very much for your letter of January twenty-fifth. I looked into the matter of the Piper book and came to the following conclusions:

As far as I can tell from your description and from the dummy, the book could not be sold here for more than \$12.50, which is a very high price. Actually it should not sell for more than \$10. Also the book should cost here about the same as in England which means you should sell it for 4 guineas.

If I decide to take seven-hundred copies, which are probably more than I can sell, I should not pay more than 30 shillings per copy. If I pay 30 shillings, the cost of every copy would be \$4.41, which includes the five per cent duty on books printed in English but does not include the costs for packing, shipping and insurance.

From these facts you will probably see for your-self that the whole transaction will be a loss for me, but I would like to do it for John Piper's sake. Let me know your reaction.

Thank you very much for your letter of March 26. I would be very greatful to you if you could give me an approximate estimate concerning what you might be able to get for the chagall painting here in U.S.A. As I mentioned in my letter the prize level I gave was solely based on an evaluation done 1948, with a crude approximation upwards to compensate for the inflation that has occured since 1948. If you give me your evaluation in terms of the net price I can get I would be very glad. I do not think, however, that the prize level I suggested is too much above the current value of the picture, at least not for Swedish conditions. This, because another picture in my father's collection, which is looked upon as almost as good as the chagall - a landscape by Pierre Bonnard - has been evaluated to similar amounts. An art dealer in Gothenburg, mr P.Börjesson, has many times asked if he might by this painting for the equivalent of 10000:-dollars, this was 1951, and since then the prize level in Sweden has gone up around 25%. As I own this painting myself I will, however, not sell it. The chagall is, however, another matter as I own it together with my sister, which makes it more convenient to

As regards the Braque I will not sell it below the prize I mentioned. If you can get this prize for it I would be glad, but otherwise I will keep it. I would be most thankful to you if you were able to sell either the Braque or the duys and I am therefore interested to hear what your collegue evaluates the Guys to. Can I get a good prize I would be glad to sell it, as I then could buy some things in U.S.A., which are relatively expensive in Sweden. However, if the prize I can get on the paintings is below the prize level in Sweden there is, of course, no idea to sell them here.

Dear Mr. Valentin,

I just got a letter from my sister concerning the Chagall painting, "Lhomme Ivre! The painting is approximately 85x65 cm and is a relatively early work of the artist, around the beginning of the first world war (I have not yet obtained the exact time). It is looked upon, by experts, as an important milestone in Chagall's development, also by the artist himself. He wanted to get the painting back from my father in exchange of two other paintings, but my father wanted to keep it at that time. Just of the paintings, but my father wanted to keep it at that time. Just of the paintings are my father wanted to sell it and had it evaluated 1947-48 for a sum equivalent to around 12.000 dollar. His sudden death thwarted this plan and during later years the painting has been in Musée National dart Moderne in Paris, when it has not been out on exhibitions. My sister is still waiting for further information from France as regards a present day evaluation, but I think we can give an approximate preliminary value without fixing any rigid limits. Since 1948, when the painting was evaluated to around 12.000 dollars which of course, as regards paintings is always a hazard, as it depends on whether there are any interested presumptive purchasers—a worldwide inflation has taken place, with an increase in general price level of some 50-100 %. Taking only this into consideration the present day value shoul be around 17.000-20.000 dollars. I have great difficulties to get any clue from the current price level on paintings here in USA, from the little I hitherto has seen from galleries and exhibitions here in this country. Sometimes I have seen astonishingly high prices on trivial paintings while especially here in Boston, there seems to be little interest in modern art. On the other hand, I find it very probable that conditions are different in new York, being a centre both of culture and people with a real interest in art and with the economical possibilities for collecting first class modern paintings. From this point of view I would not a priori think that a price around the mentioned sun should be impossible. This is the preliminary information I can give you while we are waiting for further detailed evaluations from some well orientated French friends of my sister. - I am well aware of the fact that evaluations and prices vary considerably depending on the local interest, the existence of collectors or interested museums etc. I really believe, however, that this painting can be looked upon as a very fine piece of art for a collector interested in chagall and the modern European art, and maybe new York is the right place for a selling. I would be very interested to hear your opinion what you think the previously mentioned, very approximate evaluation and the possibility to get a price roughly in this range. Should there be little interest in Chagall in U.S.A. and therefore a low price scale on his works I think it would be wiser for us to wait and later on try to get it placed in France or Switzerland. On the other hand, if the possibilities really are good here, I think it would be adviscable to try to get the painting sent here while I and my husband still are in U.S.A. - we leave for France on June 4 - as this would probably minimize possible troubles with the French costume authorities.

We are leaving boston on March 14 for Richmond, va. We do not yet know our address there, but if you send letters to my husbands address here in Boston (Dept of Physiology, Harvard medical School, 15 Shattuck St., Boston, mass) the office there can send us the mail in the case we already should have left.

Dear mr valentin,

I have been recommended by mr Gösta Ohlson, Svensk-Franska Konstgalleriet, Stockholm, and also by mrs Lolo Sarnoff, Boston, to ask you whether you might be interested in selling two paintings of mine. One is a Braque, early, painted in oil, size around 20 x 30 cm. The other one is a water colour painting by Guys, size around 20 x 35 cm.

We have recently in Sweden been offered in Sw.crowns, by a private collector, a prize for the Braque corresponding to around 2000 dollars, but as we are not in any urgent need of money in Sweden we have never been interested in selling any of the paintings I inhereted from my father's collection. We are, however, now for one year in U.S.A., as my husband works at Harvard, and we were allowed to take these two paintings out of Sweden. As we have found so many things here which we would like, if possible to take with us to Sweden, where they can not be obtained, we are interested to sell at least one of these two paintings. As you probably will understand, however, we do not want to to sell these two paintings much below the values we can get at home. I now wonder whether you think it would be possible to get a good prize for these paintings, and if you might be interested in selling them for us. If a selling should be actual we would like to have it arranged so that we get a net prize for ourselves, and above this you can take what you can get for them.

In this connection I will mention another painting, which I owe together with my half-sister, Chagall's "I'homme ivre", which since several years has been deposed in Musée de l'art moderne in Paris. It was recently on a big exposition of Chagall's art in Turin, Italy, and Chagall himself seems to be very fond of this painting as he several times wanted to get it back from my late father in exchange for some other paintings. This picture is extremely beautiful, but as we inhereted it together we are planning to sell it. We have discussed about selling it in France or Switzerland, but I now thought, that while I am here in U.S.A. I might as well see how the possibilities are here. This picture has been very highly evaluated by several experts and is quite wellknown, and we would naturally not sell it without serious considerations. I would therefore be most interested to hear your opinion about the possibility to get a good prize for this painting here in U.S.A. — I send you a catalogue including part of my father's collection, including the three paintings I have discussed here. As this book is the only one I have left, unfortunately, I would appreciate very much if you could return it to me after having got an idea about the reproductions.

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
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



SUBJ:

Lobby, 380 Madison Avenue

I have, as you know, looked at many pieces of sculpture for possible use, free-standing, in front of the main wall of the 380 lebby. Most of the representational pieces I have looked at are either controversial in their subject matter (it seems most sculptors are inspired by mude women), or thematically too specific (I have been able to find no piece which expresses "aspiration", except a Marini horse and rider).

Most of the abstract sculpture presently being done employs a thin, light, spiney, direct-metal technique and would not, I think, be suitable from a point of view of practicality, endurance, or mommentality.

The single artist whose work I feel would be most suitable for the lobby is Jacques Lipchitz. His work is represented in virtually every major museum in the Western World, and he is generally conceded to be among the three or four most important sculptors of the 20th century. I had thought that two pieces of his in particular would be suitable for 380:

One is called the "Song of the Vowels", which is a very large piece and would have to be placed on a high pedestal. The piece suggests a portion of a torse from which extend wings. Thus, there is a very strong suggestion of flight and aspiration. There are only two casts of this piece (one in France, and one in Switzerland, I think), and Lipchitz would want \$25,000 to have another casting made. Because of the size, the price, and the open nature of this piece (the other two casts are both placed out of doors), I am not sure that it would be a perfect solution to our problem.

The second piece is called "Figure" and was done, I think, in the late 30's or early 30's. It is abstract and totemic in feeling, and expresses, perhaps, man's enduring quality, rather than his aspiration. The piece stands about 6 or 7' high (and when mounted would stand still higher), and has wonderful, clean, modern, monumental quality, despite its basically primitive inspiration. Among people most familiar with modern art (men like James Johnson Sweeney, Director of the Guggenheim Museum, and Alfred Barr, Director of the Museum of Modern Art), the "Figure" would be rated among the top two or three pieces of modern sculpture.

The Museum of Modern Art has one cast of it, which they will not sell or lend. A second cast is owned by another museum, and the third and final cast is available for sale at "not less than \$14,000".

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I feel very strongly that this is the most perfect piece we could get for our lobby, and I feel also that it is the safest investment of the pieces which I know. (I would even be willing to buy this piece and rent it to Uris Building, Inc. for use in the lobby.)

If you are interested, I would like to show you the piece in the museum garden.

Several years ago I was in touch with you about an estimate on a book I wanted to print. At the time, you were very busy and although I assume you still are busy, I would like to ask you whether you would be interested in printing a volume of drawings by Paul Klee.

To be more specific: I am counting on about 128 plates, size 30 by $22\frac{1}{2}$ centimeters. All are black-and-white drawings; most of them pencil or charcoal. All the drawings belong to the Bern Museum where you would be able to look at the collection. They have about three-though drawings from which I shall make a choice.

I would like an estimate for 2000, 3000 and 4000 copies. Also I would like an estimate for having the drawings printed on one side of a page and an estimate for printing on both sides of the page.

If it is not too much trouble, I would like to have an estimate on full cloth binding.

I intend making the choice of drawings when I come to Bern in June and would like to start the job as soon as possible thereafter.
