When I was recently in New York, I consulted with various dealers and curators regarding a much needed exhibition which I am compiling for the above gallery. The general topic is to be ART REPRODUCTION.

There is only mes thought by which I can justify owners to deprive their own homes of a favorite

Several advisors named you as a collector who would definitely read with interest an explanatory letter about the exhibition and would very likely consider lending an original work. The specific thing I have in mind is Matinse's Still Life with Pineapple" (reproduced by Raymond and Raymond). But first, a general description of the proposed exhibition about reproductions.

My plan is (1) to clarify the technical processes by use of photography and (2) to evaluate the results by comparative use of originals.

My first problem to assemble a representative group of reproductions. These will range in <u>suality</u> from good to bad, and in <u>size</u> from facsimile to ministure.

Starting from this body of existing art reproductions, I must then investigate the availability of each of the originals—for I can expose only those reproductions whose originals can be located and borrowed.

Consequently, the success of this project depends from the outset upon the generosity of those owning the originals: the museums, the private collectors, and their dealers. Due to the season involved -- mid-September through November, 1954 -- the large museums will not be able to help as much as usual.* The burden must fall

*During that exact season, two of our most important sources, the Museum of Modern Art and the Whitney Museum, will be showing their entire collections--including many paintings which have been reproduced and would otherwise have been available.

principally on private collectors and dealers, and on the smaller museums.

Approximately twelve good paintings have already been promised—and our idea is only three weeks old. The list will continue to grow gradually. As it grows, we must constantly re-inspect it to balance the contents. We must obtain a carefully measured mixture of mediums, epochs, and styles in order to focus every visitor's primary attention upon the issue: ART REPRODUCTION.

I am placing my request for a Matisse with you first of all. I know from the outset that we <u>must</u> included Matisse to defend his fine, thin textures -- so consistently lost to flat uniformity in reproduction.

There is only one thought by which I can justify to weelf asking owners to deprive their own homes of a favorite painting for the duretion of a public exhibition: I feel that the owner must take real pleasure in upholding the intimate malities of a favorite artist. Thus he plays his historical part in perpetuating the values, both tangible and intangible, of the objects he possesses.

I enclose a photograph taken in a section of our current exhibition. Any cautious owner will want such evidence before agreeing to lend prized items. Should you desire further recommendations, these can be provided—either from Loukeville or from New York.

This gallery expects to assume all packing and shipping costs and to insure fully any work which is not already covered by floater insurance. I am pleased to say that with our first 60,000 visitors we have had no damages. I think it especially improbable that any damage would occur during this show. The paintings will be installed beyond arm's reach, and of course they will be guarded constantly. They will even be safeguarded against temperature and humidity changes; air-control equipment has been installed throughout our floor of the library.

We sincerely appreciate the generosity of those able to grant loans. I personally shall see that our completed exhibition merits whatever support you can offer

Should your collection contain other works which have been reproduced in any size and might be lent, I should appreciate your listing these in your reply.

Thank you for your letter of February 17th. I am very sorry to hear you did not get our catalogue. It was posted to you airmail on the 29th January, before the exhibition actually opened. However, I am sending you another copy with this letter.

Madame Renoir, as you probably know, has I think not been cast before, apart from the one on her tomb, the polychrome one in her garden, and I believe one was done in some sort of concrete. The edition is 20, and the price is £750. We have kept them as cheap as possible, so I could only make a small reduction to you, making it £700. It is really very fine. "Le Petit Forgeron" and "La Laveuse" have never been cast before. They are the first two plasters illustrated in Vollard's catalogue, and have been limited to an edition of ten. We have taken the complete editions, though of course the Louvre took one of each. "La Laveuse" is sold out, but we have some of the "Forgeron" left. Again we ask £550, and could make it £500 to you. The "Danseuse au bras levé" is the Relief. Again, you will know that this is an edition of 20, very beautiful, price £550 and £500 to you.

Dear Mr. Reid:

We are trying to finish the estimate on the costs for the traveling show of Barbara Hepworth's exhibition. It seems to me that the initial attempt to interest some of the institutions has been done properly although in a rather dilettante way because Mr. Diamond did not realize the cost involved. The fact that he thought it would be a matter of a few hundred dollars shows this fact is correct.

It is obvious that the cost for trans-Atlantic transportation will be around \$2000, which includes the return trip, for the exhibition plus one large piece.

I still expect an answer from the Custom House about the duty since, as you know, the American law does not admit abstract sculpture free of duty. This law probably makes you laugh as it makes all of us laugh, but the law will be changed someday although it might take years.

I needed the weight in order to figure the approximate costs for rall transportation throughout the country.

Enclosed is a resume of the status as it stands now. Although I am leaving tomorrow, my office will be able to take care of further negotiations with the museums and probably will be able to fix a more definite schedule by the end of this month.

Dear Mr. Valentin,

Some time ago, it may be two or three years now, the question of an exhibition of sculptures and drawings by Barbara Hepworth was discussed, and I think the idea was shelved, mainly on account of the expense which would be involved, and which might not be justified by sales. A completely new set of circumstances has arisen, however, and this letter is the result of a long conversation with Barbara herself yesterday.

As you probably know, she is having a very large retrospective show at the Whitechapel Gallery London, which opens on April 7th, and remains open until the middle of June. The catalogue is not quite ready yet, but a copy of it will be airmailed to you on Tuesday, so that you can get a better idea of what the show is like. Barbara has been in touch with one or two of the Museums in America, and Mr. Harold Diamond, whom I think you probably know, has been extremely active in trying to knock some scheme together, whereby a fairly comprehensive exhibition of her sculpture can be shown in various cities in the United States, and where the expenses would be shared by the Museums, with a possible contribution from the British Council, and another from B.C. Gregory. As a result of this, the sculpture would be landed in America more or less free of charge to you, but Barbara would like to feel that some responsible person was keeping contact with the various museums, and attending to the business side. Those that have so far indicated their desire to hold the exhibition are the Institute of Contemporary Art, Washington, who would like to open their show on September 1st, the Baltimore Museum, the Albright Gallery Buffalo, the Arts Club of Chicago, the Walker Art Center, Minneapolis, and the San Francisco Museum of Art. Others may wish to join in once the scheme is launched, and Barbara's idea is that with all the publicity that would arise from these exhibitions, you might hold a show yourself later on, and she would then ship a certain number of smaller pieces for your exhibition only.

If you agreed to act as her agent in connection with this tour, you would be entitled to a commission on everything sold, and there are already guarantees of some five or six pieces being bought. John Rood the sculptor had a pre-view of her show here, bought one for himself, and was most enthusiast about the idea of sending a group to America. Mr. Diamond is also going to call and see you, probably some time next week, and will tell you what he has in mind.

The matter is one of comparative urgency, because when the London exhibition is dismantled in mid June, it would be so much simpler to crate the pieces on the spot and ship them direct to Washington, who, as I said, are prepared to open the exhibition on 1st September. The sequence after that would require to be organised to fit in with the galleries other activities, and also for transit. If, therefore, you could write to me so that your letter would arrive before Easter, saying whether in principle you would be interested, I would much appreciate hearing from you. Meantime, I am sorry to trouble you with such a lengthy epistle, but it is the only way of explaining all the details.

Are we going to see you over here in the near future? If so, of course it would be so much easier to discuss further details on the spot. Barbara said she had heard you had not been well, but I hope by now you are quite fit again.

Dear Mr. Reid:

o Braton B In reply to your letter of April second regarding the exhibition planned for Barbara Hepworth's work in this country, I have decided to cooperate with your and Barbara's intentions although, for the time being, I do not want to obligate myself further than to promine to arrange the planned exhibition and take care of the business end of it. Whether I shall be able to give Barbara an exhibition in my gallery, I cannot decide now. But since you were rather eager to make a decision about the exhibitions which, apparently, have been arranged for several institutions in the U.S., I would like to let you know I am willing to help.

So far I have not received the catalog of the exhibition. Also I have not received a visit from Mr. Diamond.

The listing of the institutions interested in the exhibition seems rather vague. Yesterday I happened to talk to Edgar Schenck, Director of the Albright Art Gallery in Buffalo, who said he would include Barbara's work in an exhibition of young English sculptors which the Museum is planning for the Spring of 1955, which does not mean he is giving Barbara a one-man show.

I appreciate John Rood's enthusiasm although you probably agree with me that he is a very poor sculptor, and his influence in this country, even in Minneapolis where he lives, does not amount to very much.

I shall probably be in London around June tenth, and we can talk about the details then. I would like to see Barbara's

Dear Mr. Reid:

This letter is in regard to the Helworth exhibition which I hope I shall see in June although I will arrive a few days after the closing. I wrote Barbara the other day and asked her whether there would be any chance of the exhibition being extended.

I had a conference with Mr. Diamond and as far as I can see, there are four institutions <u>definitely</u> interested in the exhibition: Institute of Contemporary Art in Washington, Arts Club of Chicago, Walker Art Center in Minneapolis and the Baltimore Museum of Art.

I am afraid Mr. Diamond is not aware of the very high costs, and although he is willing to contribute a few hundred dollars it is my experience that in shipping exhibitions of sculpture a few hundred dollars is just a "drop in the bucket".

If this exhibition is to take place, heis necessary to have some important and large pieces—at least three or four—and not less than twenty-five smaller pieces. Therefore I think the thing to do is to make a good selection from the exhibition and get an estimate from Bolton & Fairhead for packing and shipping to the U.S.

Peter Gregory used to be willing to contribute to the costs, and I wonder whether you are willing as Barbara Hepworth's dealer. In any event whenever we have the total costs, we will see how much money the participating museums will be willing to contribute because even after the arrival of the shipment in New York the costs for shipping the collection by Railway Express throughout the country will be considerable.
