The Rodin, "Study for Seated Woman" was a study for a figure that Rodin had planned for his monumental project "Gate of Hell". The figure was executed in 1889 and cast by Rudier in Paris. The bronze measures 20% inches high, and is listed #249 in the Musee Rodin Catalogue.

The Rodin, "Standing Faun" is listed as "La Faunesse Debout", #132 in the Musee Rodin Catalogue. This faun was one of the figures of the Tympan of the "Gate of Hell". The bronze was executed in 1884 and stands 24 3/4 inches high. This bronze was also cast by Rudier.

These two Rodins were exhibited at the Curt Valentin Gallery, May 4 to 29, 1954. The exhibition travelled throughout the United States and was shown in the various Museums listed in the enclosed catalogue.

"The Bull and Condor" by Jacques Lipchitz was made in 1932. This bronze was included in the large Jacques Lipchitz Retrospective Exhibition held at the Museum of Modern Art, New York, The Walker Art Center, Minneapolis, Minnesota and the Cleveland Museum of Art, Cleveland, Ohio, in 1954. It is illustrated on page #62 of the Museum of Modern Art catalogue.






