We are greatly embarrassed by your claim with respect to the small drawing by Cezanne, "Bathers". There is nothing in the Gallery records to indicate that it is other than a Gal-lery property. I suggest that you permit me to wait until Mr. Abircht returns, for he may have some notation which will be helpful.

Finally, as to the "Diana," I too received from David Thompson the same suggestion that he telephoned to you. Gertrud Lenart who is interested in the painting also suggested a private auction in New York. Accordingly, if you will let me know in advance of your next visit, I will inform all of the interested parties of a time and date to meet in my office in New York.
