There are a few prices you may find low, as e.g. the terracottas by Laurens but you must consider that we have made 6 casts of these terracottas and that terracottas don't sell well and that therefore we have still casts left at Paris.

As to the works by Masson, there are 8, your numbers 1763, 1862, 1863, 1864, 2655, 2670, 2733, 3010, which belong entirely to Galerie Louise Leiris.

I talked on the telephone with Dave Thompson in Pittsburgh today and we discussed the following matters:

- 1. I confirmed to him that he could purchase the Laurens collage No. 18133 for \$700.
- 2. I told him I found it impossible to sell him the Leger "Compass and Playing Cards" for \$1,500 as he requested. I told him that the cost was \$1,250 and I finally agreed to sell him the painting for \$2,500.
- 3. As to the large, yellow Juan Gris, I told him I could do nothing about it, inasmuch as it was owned half by Kahnweiler, and the lowest price I could sell it for is \$10,000.
- 4. Thompson said that at the end of our liquidation, he would be willing to buy every Klee item which we still owned at cost plus 20%. I told him that I could not make that kind of a deal with him, but that I would invite a lot of dealer bids on whatever we have left, and that I would give him an opportunity to top any bid we received. This was entirely satisfactory to him.
- 5. He also stated that he would be interested in buying all of the remaining Matisse bronzes on something like the same basis, and I stated that I would give him that opportunity.

It is now about seven months since Curt Valentin's sudden and tragic death, and I feel that at this time I owe you some report on the future of the Gallery.

As you know, I as the Executor, was authorized by the Will either to continue the business of the Curt Valen-tin Gallery or to liquidate it. After talking with many of Curt's close friends, including many museum directors and curators, I early determined that, on the one hand, it was of the utmost importance that the Gallery be continued if it could be continued under proper auspices and in the spirit of Curt's work and, on the other hand, that it should not be continued in any other circumstances.

For the past seven months I have made every effort, with the help of those same friends of Curt's and museum workers, to find a proper person or group of persons who desired to continue the Gallery. I have had many applicants but none who in my judgment, and in the judgment of those with whom I counselled, met the high requirements which I imposed. In accordance, therefore, with my basic decision that it would be better to close the Gallery than to have it continue under other than the most desirable auspices, I am now reluctantly compelled to inform you of my decision that the Gallery must ultimately be liquidated. I can no longer continue to operate the Gallery in a kind of twilight zone without making that basic policy decision.

This is not to say that the Gallery's doors will be closed tomorrow or that its stock will suddenly be dumped on the market or into public auction for liquidation. On

the contrary, I conceive that my duty as Executor requires quite a different course. By primary legal duty as Executor is to the heirs. However, this does not blind me to my concurrent moral obligation to the artists who were at one and the same time Curt's close personal friends and the backbone of the Gallery - the important contributors to both Curt's financial success and his fine artistic reputation.

Fortunately, I believe that my legal obligation to the heirs and my moral obligation to the artists are not in conflict and that they both dictate that I follow the same course in liquidation. That course, as I see it, is to cooperate with the artists in every way possible to find new gallery homes in New York and to work out with such new galleries, in each instance, the best manner of liquidating the works of the artist still owned by the Valentin Gallery. I believe that in many, if not in most, cases the gallery which will be fortunate enough to secure an affiliation with one or more of the Valentin artists will desire to take over from the Valentin Gallery many, if not all, of the artists works. I hope that this will be true so that the new gallery will, on the one hand, have a stock of its artist's works and, on the other, that a forced liquidation by the Valentin Gallery will not injure the artist's market through the sale of works at less than their market value.

Accordingly, I am writing this letter on the same day to each of the artists who has been affiliated with the Valentin Gallery. I am inviting you, as I am inviting each of the other artists, to determine with which New York gallery you would prefer to affiliate since the Valentin Gallery is to be liquidated. If you desire to do so, I would be happy to have you write me of your preference and if you wish me, on your behalf, to take up the question of your new affiliation, I will be happy to do so. If, on the other hand, you would prefer to proceed directly, or through different channels than me, to make such affiliation, that, too, will of course be entirely satisfactory. I only request that, in any event, both in your own interest and in the interest of the Valentin Estate, you let me know if you make a new gallery affiliation so that I can confer with the gallery director in an effort to make arrangements beneficial to all concerned.

Many New York gallery owners have from time to time approached me and expressed interest in one or more of the Valentin artists in the event that the Gallery must be liquidated. Accordingly, if you care to communicate with me and desire my opinion as to one or more galleries which might properly handle your work in the future, I will be happy to give you such information as I have and to do everything else to help you.

I repeat that the matter is not one which requires your decision temorrow or next week. The Valentin Gallery will remain open and active at least for the balance of this season and may possibly even continue thereafter. The decision which I am making at this time must be made in order to give direction to our future operations. It does not mean, however, that this decision will be reflected in any immediate or sudden action at the Gallery.

I cannot end without saying once more how sorry I am to be compelled to reach this decision. Nor can I end without expressing to you, as I have to the other artists affiliated with the Gallery, my deep appreciation for your loyalty, cooperation and consideration during the period of the past seven months which have been so difficult for me. I can only attempt to repay that loyalty and cooperation by I can only attempt to repay that loyalty and cooperation by offering to each of you the assistance proffered in the earlier part of this letter. I shall await some word from you.

In my meeting with Martha Jackson yesterday I found that she was correct. In making our calculations we had included the two large Marini paintings.

The corrected calculation included sculptures at a list price of \$22,200 plus drawings at list prices of \$9,100. These totalled \$31,300 and at a 30% discount (\$9,390) would have resulted in a net price of \$21,910.

I agreed with Mrs. Jackson to round this off to a total price of \$21,750 instead of the price of \$22,500 previously agreed on. This will be payable, as before, in three equal installments but each installment will be \$7,250 instead of \$7,500. For your records, I am sending you herewith a copy of the corrected letter agreement. You should correct your copy of the bill accordingly. Mrs. Jackson promised to send me the first check for \$7,250 promptly.

Enclosed herewith is Mrs. Jackson's check to the order of the Gallery for \$6,000 in full payment for the five Henry Moore sculptures.

Attached hereto are photostatic copies of the three accounts which were kept on the books of this callery for Mr. Jacques Lipchitz, covering the last five years, i.e. the time from January 1, 1950 to December 31, 1954 inclusive.

The old account shows a debit balance of which is partly offset by a credit balance of 2750.00 on new account, leaving a difference of 860,22 which Mr. Lipchits owes to the Gallery.

The new account was started in May 1954, shortly before Mr. Valentin left for his last trip to Europe. The instructions, which I received at that time, were to the effect, that Mr. Valentin had made an agreement with Mr. Lipchitz, according to which Mr. Valentin was to acquire from Mr. Lipchitz \$12,000. worth of sculptures every year, and had to pay Mr. Lipchitz \$1,000. each month.

The Paris castings account represents payments made to Mr. Lipchitz in reimbursement of cost of castings made in Paris of his works. The total of such payments amounted to \$2300. which was transferred in May 1954 to Old Account, so that the Peris Account is completely balanced

Would you, accordingly, do two things: arrange that this payment is promptly made in the future in the same method as it was made in the past and arrange immediately to reimburse to Mr. Fritz Valentin 200 marks which he advanced to Mrs. Goeze to keep her from being evicted. As you probably know, Mr. Fritz Valentin's address is Holthusen Strasse 13, Hamburg-Volksdorf, Germany.

I would appreciate it if you would let me know when you have actually sent the remittance to Mr. Valentin.
