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Excerpts from the text of Carola Giedion-Welcker's Contemporary Sculpture:

"A new and fundamental sense of space seems to be manifesting itself. Figures and objects are no longer placed in self-contained isolation; the sculptor's aim is to animate the space surrounding the form and emanating from the form. He uses every possible means of bringing space to life as an emotional stimulus. Man is no longer the measure of all things; his microcosm has been absorbed into a much larger macrocosm. It is obvious that this new conception of space is far closer to the Baroque philosophy of life than to the Classical. The tradition descends, by way of Daumier and Rodin, to the sculptors of today, a tradition that began at the moment when light and shade first attacked the sculptured mass, causing it to reach out into its wider environment."

"The subject matter of today's sculpture is often challenged by an uneasy or hostile public; it is neither the narration of an event, not the description of the 'beautiful' physical forms which still populate the public parks of every land. The language of the living sculpture of today is symbolic, not narrative; it communicates universal aspects of spiritual or natural events, but not banalities decked out in human form.

"The abandonment of the naturalistic model, the purely visual experience, and all anatomical conventions in the representation of the human figure cannot be interpreted merely as a reaction to rationalism. New, hidden worlds of inner experience have come to the surface, requiring a language of symbols that points from the visible world in which we live to another world of invisible powers. Thus, in works whose original impulse was the human figure, we find startling abbreviations. There is an impressive revival of the torso and the fragment in Rodin, Brancusi, Lehmbruck, Maillol, Archipenko and Schlemmer, culminating in the magic gesture of the arm of a Giacometti figure, or in the fabulous, feitsh-like forms of Max Ernst, Mirc and Klee. A tendency to abbreviate, to abstract, is manifest everywhere, and the human figure has a suprapersonal communication to make which far transcends its existential form."

"This recollection of a mysterious unification of man with nature and the world of creatures is also expressed in sculptures which embody a demoniac menace to man's existence and have a certain kinship of form with the masks and totems of primitive religions. From this irrational sphere, the eternally present past of man makes its way into the present, and so into present-day art, The conscious and merciless domination of the present by technology, on the other hand, has left its mark on the sculpture of the younger generation. The insecurity of modern man finds its paradoxical counterpoint in the precision of the machine. The humorous fables which flowed from Gonzales' hand in his mastery of traditional Catalan wroughtion work are matched by the technical harshness and cruelty of the current generation of subports. This is the language of a generation which has been taught by events to turn a critical eye on the world."

Catalogue:

"The reason why the birth of religious painting in northern Europe—in the lands of stained glass windows was so belated was that for the colorist stained glass was his most powerful medium of expression. The fact that the word 'painting' is linked up with pictures has paralyzed us . . (Malraux), yet stained glass is certainly the most specialized of the painter's arts. It is the art most bound, as we shall see, by purely physical conditions to its own formal devices; it is an art which not only creates surfaces of imagery, but being a source of light transforms some actual place. Stained glass is thus literally an architectural element. For all of these reasons it is an art quick to die when tyramized. How this art of stained glass evolved, Hourished, and declined; how is was ignored and revived is thus a story which takes us deep into the forces which have shaped the art of the past ten centuries.

"By the sixteenth century it was not unusual for the glass painter to be given the task of imitating in stained glass a 'school of Raphael' freesco carton. Engraved reproductions of such works, by Marcantonio Raimondi and others, at the time were being circulated throughout scending mercantile patron as the final word in taste. Fine Art had been born and was beginning to be 'applied' to certain of the traditional arts, in this new hierarchy eash painting had become supreme and all of the other arts were practically shamed into imitating its effects. With his own standards of excellence thus revoked, illuminator, and mosaicist, was reduced to a common laborer, his traditional skills committed to the four winds. He was held to a formula altern not only to his instincts, but to the very nature of his medium. He could neither biberate himself from the structurally necessary networks the characteristics of painting, allow them to retain the normal decorative function. He had to try to hide them. Thus the 'lost art' of stained glass was never really lost; it was thrown awa."

"Rouault, whenever he has departed from his true medium, easel painting, to make tapestries, ceramics, or even engravings—has conceded very little to that other art form. Rather, he has been content to hire the best French craftsmen to torture their material into pseudo Rouaults', complete with all of the accidental, or at least purely painterly effects of his brushwork. If this essay shows anything, it shows the consequences of such dilettantism in the past. Hence the curious paradox that while the Rouault vindows are more deeply spiritual in content, the lighter windows of Matisse at Vence, by comparison almost frivolous, penetrate more deeply into that mystique which it is the peculiar province of stained glass to evoke . . the windows at Vence are undeniably closer to the early windows when judged in terms, not of the qualities to which they allude, but rather those that they embody."


