We appreciate your prompt reply to our most recent letter. We are proceeding with the listing of the SUNSET STRIP at \$7.50, since you have indicated your agreement in the price revision.

A word of explanation regarding our request for our usual 50% discount. Our overhead on \$7.50 is about 30%, roughly, \$2.25, which leaves us with about \$1.50 as a margin, on a retail sale. However, we must give other booksellers a discount of 33 1/3%, and on this type of sale we lose \$1.00 per copy. What our profit averages to in the end, if we manage to sell as many copies retail as we do to booksellers, is about \$.50 per book. It would be somewhat difficult for us to operate with less than a 50% discount on this basis; we hope you will agree with us, and that we can continue at this rate.

About the review copies and clippings—I will be glad to check into this, but as Rosalie King is now gone, and I am still a bit green at this angle of the job as yet, it may take a few days. We will definitely, however, be working on THE SUNSET STRIP, and will place ads in the VILLAGE VOICE and ART INTERNATIONAL for this title. We will also be sending out about 10 review copies at our cost; I will try to keep track of these and keep you up to date on results. We are of course open to any further suggestions from you regarding magazines and periodicals to which you might wish some of these copies sent.



TWENTY-SIX GASOLINE STATIONS, by Edward Ruscha. "400 copies printed in April, 1963, by the Cunningham Press, Alhambra, California."

It is perhaps unfair to write a review of a book which, by now, is probably completely unavailable. But the book is so curious, and so doomed to oblivion that there is an obligation, of sorts, to document its existence, record its having been here, in the same way, almost, as other pages record and document the ephemeral existence of exhibitions which are mounted, shown, and then broken up forever.

"Twenty-six Gasoline Stations," is a book consisting of 26 photographs of gasoline stations in various parts of America. There is no text of any kind. Each photograph is carefully captioned with only the most essential information: "Flying A, Kingman, Arizona." The photographs are not professional — most of them are not even good.

Ruscha is a young pop artist whose work, incidentally, does not particularly relate to gasoline stations. "Twenty-six Gasoline Stations" is a pop-art book. Captioned soberly are "reproductions" of 26 works of art. Not quite a joke, the idea is at least as complex as the puns and issues posed by Duchamp's urinal; we are irritated and annoyed by the act, but feel compelled to resolve the questions it raises. The urinal resolved in favor of Duchamps; for Ruscha and the movement he represents, the issue is still in doubt.

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

Watson Urges Height Hearing

Passage of the Beverly Hills Height and Density ordinance was urged by Councilman Leroy Watson recently.

A hearing on the Beverly Hills hospital scheduled for Aug. 20 has been postponed to Sept. 17, city councilmen agreed.

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ZIP Means Faster Mail

The Post Office Department has put into effect its new ZIP Code Program (Zone Improvement Program).

provement Program).

ZIP is designed to speed mail delivery through the expansion of the present system of postal zoning. The code consists of five digits, the first three to be used by all mallers of the community who will receive an announcement from the Beverly Hills Post Office as to their correct number. Patrons are requested not to call the Post Office about the numbers.

bers.

Postmaster Thomas Lawlor explained the code this way: the first digit designates a large geographical area covering several states; second digit is a part of that area; the third digit a large city or sectional center seving several cities. The last two digits designate either a local delivery unit, such as a main post office or sub station.

Lawlor stressed that residents should learn to attach their code number automatically to letters and return addresses, and note down new numbers from incoming mail. The code number is properly placed after the name of the state, i.e., Beverly Hills, California 90210.

In one of the catalogs to the current County Museum exhibition entitled "Six Painters and the Object" Lawrence Alloway refers to a book by Ed Ruscha. Its title is "Twenty-six Gasoline Stations", and its purpose seems nothing more than to show how 26 out of 20 million gasoline stations look. There is no commentary save a title for each photograph and the location. It's a mysterious book.

ANYTHING BEYOND this I am not at all sure of, and in attempting to figure out some sort of critical analysis I discovered only that this book—which is approached as a work of art—is wont to be criticized. It says nothing, does nothing, judges nothing, does nothing, genands nothing and wants nothing. For a critic this is embarrassing, unfair and just not playing the art game. Ruscha and a handful of other contemporary artists aren't playing the art game either; and that's one of the reasons this book is important.

Art, contrary to a ridiculous

and that's one of the reasons this book is important.

Art, contrary to a ridiculous aesthetic theory, is not the "play" of the adult. Neither is it a luxury or an esoteric, ivyclad idea. To discover what it is may be the job of the critic, but to make what art is, is the job of the artist, So, if Ruscha makes art out of 26 gasoline stations, neither public or critic should have the audacity to say what is and what is not art. Just as the ancient Egyptians destroyed their artistic development — and eventually their civilization — by foreing these narrow judgments upon the artist, so the public (and critical) tyranny relentlessly attempts it. It is a battle that has become tradition in western civilization. And proof that this war is an unnecessary absurdity exists in simply considering Greek or Oriental attitudes toward art. These societies accepted art on its own terms, and appreciated it for what it was—the product of the artist.

A CONNECTION BETWEEN Oriental aesthetics and "Twenty-six Gasoline Stations" may not be visual but the book left me with the same feeling I've had in reading a volume of Japanese poetry. It is a mysterious, aloof, poignant sensitivity in which reality is never stated but only presented. Ruscha's book is like that, too. For if I find loneliness in his journey of gasoline stations that goes from Los Angeles to Groom, Texas, then It is my loneliness. If the road looks long and the towns isolated, the artist has left me the right to sense it without phony, tricky illusions that attempt to force my sensibilities and mangle my attitudes—that's advertising, not

I think that's what critic John Coplans meant when he said, on first showing me the book, that I should ignore one called "Shell, Daggett, California" because it was an "aesthetic one."
