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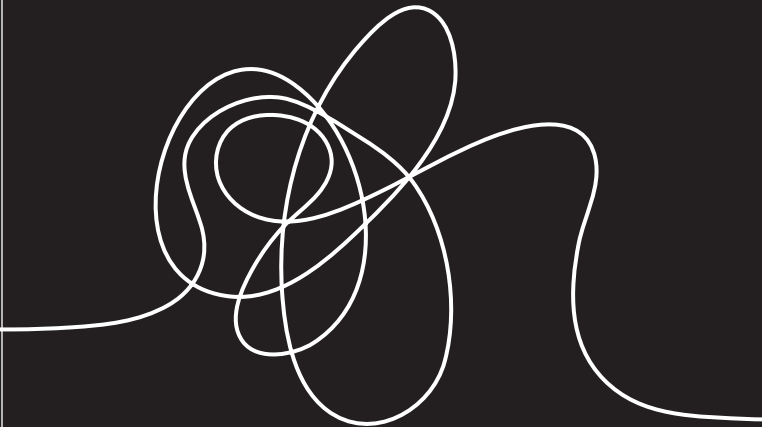

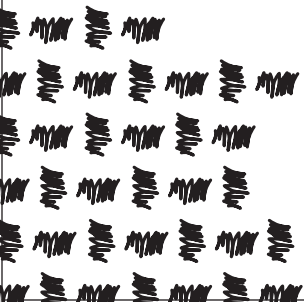
Welcome to MoMA!

Look for patterns in works of art, in the building, or even on someone's clothes. Fill this page with different patterns you find.

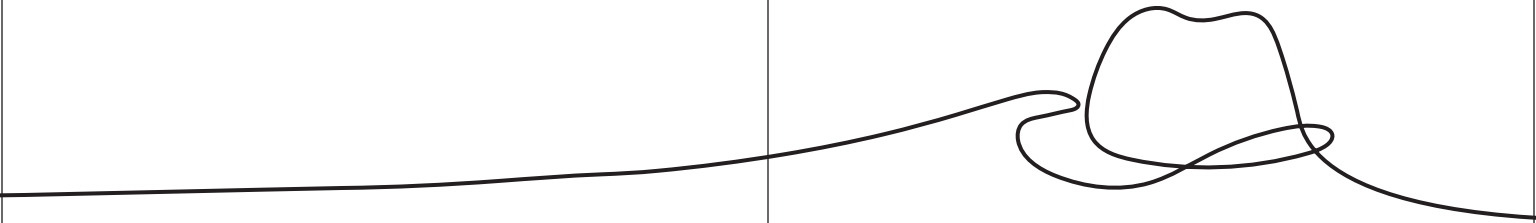


Search for shadows and light on walls and floors. What shapes and patterns do they create? Sketch them.
