MUSEUM'S SCHOOL TO SHOW NEW WORK

An exhibition of paintings by children, parents and teachers done during the first two weeks of the current fall term of art classes at the People's Art Center will be on view at the Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street, from October 15 through November 23.

Art work from classes where children and their parents work individually but in the same studio and with the same media will be included along with a sampling of work done by children and young people between the ages of 3 and 18. Work from classes for New York City elementary school teachers will also be shown.

"Perhaps the most significant aspect of the exhibition," says Victor D'Amico, Director of the People's Art Center, "is that, although we are showing work from classes conducted by 16 different teachers, it is apparent that all the teachers have a similar approach toward creative work and stimulating the child to put individual expression, personal exploration and freedom above other considerations."

The pictures in the exhibition are characterized by gay color. Traditional fall themes, experiments in painting and pictures of children and people predominate.

The work shown was completed during the first two of the term's 15 sessions. Classes meet once a week for one hour or for one and a half hours. Six hundred and sixty children and 552 adults are enrolled in the current semester.
