A retrospective exhibition of the work of the American painter Hiles Spencer (1893-1952), organized by the Museum of Modern Art's Department of Circulating Exhibitions, has just left New York for an 8 months tour around the country. Its first showing is at the Akron Art Institute where it will be on view through February 21. The memorial exhibition, consisting of 32 paintings and 9 drawings loaned to this exhibition from public and private collections, was selected by Dorothy Miller, Curator of Collections at the Museum of Modern Art. Other institutions where it will be shown include the Cincinnati Art Museum, the Currier Gallery of Art in Manchester, New Hampshire and the Walker Art Center in Minneapolis.
