The Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street, today announced a series of gallery talks to be given at the Museum at 3:00 P.M. on the Monday after the opening of each new Exhibition during the 1934-1935 season. The talks will be a regular feature of the Museum's new educational program and will be given by Miss Ernestine Fantl of the Museum staff. For the past two years Miss Fantl has lectured for the Museum on modern art and architecture to private and public schools, clubs, and art groups.

The opening talk of the series will be given at three o'clock Monday afternoon, September 24. The subject will be the Public Works of Art Project. Paintings, sculpture and other works done under the Project and exhibited in Washington are now on display in the Museum.

On Monday, October 22, Miss Fantl will talk on the large Housing Exhibition which will open at the Museum October 16. Later lectures will be given on modern painting and sculpture; Henry Hobson Richardson and the beginning of American modern architecture; George Caleb Bingham, who was known as the "Missouri Artist"; and Gaston Lachaise, the noted American sculptor.

The gallery talks are free to members. A fee of 25¢ per person is made to the public.
