A gallery talk by Miss Ernestine Fantl will be given at The Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53 Street, Monday afternoon, November 26, at four o'clock. The subject of the talk will be "Modern Works of Art" as exemplified in the Fifth Anniversary Exhibition of the Museum which opened to the public last Tuesday.

The Exhibition, which fills all four floors of the Museum, illustrates comprehensively the beginnings and progress of the modern art movement. The pioneers of the movement -- Cézanne, Gauguin, Rousseau, Seurat and Van Gogh -- are especially well represented by a group of masterpieces on the second floor of the Museum. The first floor is devoted to modern sculptors and the third and fourth floors to twentieth-century artists.

Gallery talks, which are given the first Monday after the opening of each exhibition, are free to members of the Museum. All others are charged a fee of 25¢, plus the regular Museum admission charge of 25¢ to non-members on Mondays and Fridays.

The Museum announces a change in its hours, effective immediately. The new schedule is as follows: Monday to Friday, 10 A.M. to 5 P.M.; Saturday, 10 A.M. to 6 P.M.; Sunday, 2 to 6 P.M.
