TWO NEW FILMS AT MUSEUM OF MODERN ART:

WITHOUT YOU THERE IS ONLY DARKNESS, JACKBOOT MUTINY

The week of new, unreleased German film showings at the Museum of Modern Art will conclude with Without You There Is Only Darkness, Tuesday, October 28, and Jackboot Mutiny, Wednesday, October 29. Both films will be shown at 3 and 5:30.

Made possible by the cooperation of the Export-Union of the German Film Industry and its American representative, Munio Podhorzer, the films were selected by the Museum from a large number of recent German productions. All seven films shown during the week are expected to be distributed commercially in the near future.

An explicit and realistic drama about drug addiction, Without You There Is Only Darkness (Ohne Dich wird es Nacht) has a cast including Eva Bartok, Curt Jurgens and Rene Daltgen. The 1956 film, produced by Filmaufbau-Arca, was directed by Curt Jurgens from a script by Walter Forster. Shown through courtesy of United German Film Enterprises.

Jackboot Mutiny (Es Gesachah am 20 Juli), also known as It Happened July 20th, is a dramatic depiction of the 1944 plot to assassinate Hitler. G. W. Pabst directed the 1956 Arison-Arca production from W. P. Zibaso and Gustav Machaty's script. Bernard Wicki, Karl Ludwig Diehl, Carl Wery and Kurt Meisel are featured.

A 13-week retrospective of German films will follow.
