PYGMALION, BERNARD SHAW FILM AT MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

George Bernard Shaw's Pygmalion, the 1938 film with Wendy Hiller and Leslie Howard, will be shown at the Museum of Modern Art on Thursday, May 4, at 8:30 p.m. The story, of a phonetics professor who wagers that he can transform a "guttersnipe" cockney flower girl so completely that she can "pass off as a duchess," was adapted by Shaw from his 1912 play.

Tickets for the film, \$1.50, are on sale at the Museum or may be ordered by mail. Museum members receive a 25 per cent discount on one or two. Tickets include admission to galleries, open every Thursday until 10 p.m. Dinner and refreshments are available.
