From October 18 through November 25 the Museum of Modern Art will exhibit EUROPEAN PRINT ACQUISITIONS, a two-part show consisting of "Five Painters As Printmakers," Walter Sickert, Félix Vallotton, Paul Signac, Christian Rohlfis and André Masson, and "New Prints From Germany, Poland and Russia," many of which are shown for the first time in the United States. The exhibition is directed by William S. Lieberman, Curator of Drawings and Prints, and installed by Elaine L. Johnson, Assistant Curator.

The important but little-known graphic work of the three post-impressionist painters includes etchings by Sickert, woodcuts by Vallotton and prints by Signac. Sickert (1860-1942), one of England's foremost painters, turned society's routine situations into poignant and witty comments, of which the Camden town interiors are characteristic. Bolder in technique and treatment are the woodcuts of Vallotton. Using a style influenced by Japanese woodcuts and the art of Paul Gauguin, Vallotton observed the Parisian manners and politics of the 1890's and early 1900's with wry amusement. Signac, instrumental in the revival of color lithography in France in the 1890's, portrays boats and harbors using the pointilist formula he developed with his friend Seurat.

The prints, 1909-1925, by Christian Rohlfis, are largely selected from the recent acquisition of 53 prints made possible by a gift of the Matthew T. Mellon Foundation Fund. Rohlfis (1849-1938), a pioneer of German Expressionist painting, retained a painter's approach to his graphic work by individualizing each proof with an ingenious use of printing and overpainting.

Prints by André Masson during the decade, 1949-1958, survey the contemporary French painter's major output since he returned to France after his war-time exile in the United States.

In the sections of the exhibition dealing with "New Prints From Germany, Poland and Russia," representative works of young Germans done between 1959-1961 reveal the vigor and diversity of a contemporary German graphic art no longer dominated by the woodcut medium. The selection of 14 prints by 7 contemporary Polish artists shows a concern for technical experimentation.

In the Russian section five members of the Leningrad Experimental Graphic Workshop are represented by 34 lithographs of the last few years. Of particular interest are the series of illustrations by Anatoly Kaplan for three books by Sholom Aleichem: The Enchanted Tailor, Song of Songs, Tevia, The Milkman and One Kid.
