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The Garden Restaurant at The Museum of Modern Art has a new name and a new look.

Now called KONDITORI in the Garden, the new menu features a variety of Danish open-face sandwiches, pastries and coffee. Prices range from 75 cents for sandwiches based on herring tidbits with onions and capers or fried filet of sole with Remoulade sauce to \$1.50 for freshly shelled tiny Danish shrimps or roast duck with red cabbage and apples.

Desserts include Danish Apple Cake, Cherry Heering Chocolate Cake, Marzipan Tart and Almond Ring. Chokolade Sundaes and various kinds of coffee including Capuccino, Espresso and Warsaw (coffee, milk, whipped cream and shavings of bitter chocolate) are available.

The self-service restaurant is open to the public daily from 11:30 a.m., Sundays from noon, until shortly before the Museum closes at 6 p.m. The menu will remain the same throughout the day with a \$1 minimum during the lunch hour.

The glass-walled restaurant and adjoining terrace overlook the Museum's Sculpture Garden. Although the fountains are stilled by city decree because of the water shortage, the Garden is still a pleasant oasis in midtown Manhattan. Works by Auguste Rodin, Henry Moore, Alexander Calder, among others, are placed throughout the marbled paved court among a variety of birches, weeping beeches and islands of ivy.

The new restaurant is under the management of The Brody Corporation which has also taken over the management of the Museum Members' Penthouse Restaurant, now a service restaurant with Continental cuisine. On Thursday evenings (when the Museum is open until 10 p.m.) dinner is served to the public in the 6th floor Penthouse before the Jazz in the Garden promenade concerts, and the KONDITORI provides an assortment of sandwiches, pastries and hot and cold drinks.

The Brody Corporation also operates the Rainbow Room and Rainbow Grill in Rockefeller Center and owns and operates Gallagher's Steak House.

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
