GUIDE TO MODERN ART IN EUROPE, second (revised) edition. 120 pages, 26 illustrations. Paperbound, \$1.50. Published by the Junior Council of The Museum of Modern Art, with the cooperation of Pan American Airways. Distributed by Doubleday and Co., Inc.

GUIDE TO MODERN ART IN EUROPE, a new, revised edition of the guidebook devoted exclusively to collections of art since 1850, has been published by the Junior Council of The Museum of Modern Art with the cooperation of Pan American Airways.

Published in a small format which fits easily into the traveller's pocket or handbag, the GUIDE lists approximately 420 museums, galleries, and private collections of modern art to which visitors are regularly admitted. Twenty-seven countries in Europe, including the Iron Curtain countries, are covered, with listings for museum or gallery addresses, hours, and admission charges, all of which have been checked and brought up to date since the publication of the first edition in 1963. In addition, some new entries have been made.

Many less-known collections, not found in most general European guides, are included in the compact 120-page book, which is illustrated by 26 photographs.

"Cities...hold no monopoly on modern art in Europe," notes William S. Lieberman, Curator of Drawings and Prints at the Museum, in his introduction to the GUIDE.

"Several provincial towns, a surprising number, house important private or specialized collections....Although the guide is intended for the interested tourist, the art 'professional' will find it as necessary as comfortable shoes."

A list of art publications in each country supplements the gallery and museum information, providing excellent references for the interested museum-goer.

The Junior Council of The Museum of Modern Art is a membership organization of about 60 men and women who share an interest in the arts. Among the Council's activities, which supplement the Museum's program, are the Art Lending Service for Museum members, the publication each year of an illustrated appointment calendar, and the sponsorship of special events and lectures. Mrs. Douglas Auchincloss and Mrs. Alfred R. Stern, Co-Chairmen of the Junior Council, have written the preface
