HENRY MOORE FILM TO BE SHOWN AT MUSEUM

"Henry Moore: A Man of Form," a 60-minute documentary originally produced for CBS News and now in The Museum of Modern Art's Television Archive of the Arts, will be shown at noon, Wednesday, May 6, at the Museum, as part of the Wednesday-at-Noon Series, under the direction of Margareta Akermark, Associate Director of the Department of Film.

Produced by William McClure and narrated by Charles Collingwood, the film mixes interview with commentary. Mr. Moore discusses his youth, development, the influences upon him, and his work. There are scenes of the artist at work, including the initial selection of marble in Italy, the actual work in his studios, and the installation of the finished product.

Exhibitions of Mr. Moore's sculpture will be in New York through May 16 at the Knoedler and Marlborough-Gerson Galleries. In addition, his monumental sculpture is a permanent fixture at Lincoln Center, and there are numerous works by him in the collection of The Museum of Modern Art.
