FREE RECITAL OF ELIZABETHAN AND SPANISH SONGS AT MODERN

Singer Ann Draper and classical guitarist Herbert Levine will give a free recital of Elizabethan and 20th-century Spanish songs in the sculpture garden of The Museum of Modern Art, 8 West 54 Street, June 18 and 19 at 8 pm. The program will include compositions by John Dowland, Thomas Campian, Enrique Granados and Joaquin Rodrigo.

Miss Draper has studied voice with Eleanor Steber and she and Mr. Levine have studied the classical guitar under Leonid Bolatine. Both artists have given numerous recitals.

The program is part of The Museum's SUMMERCARDEN weekends. The sculpture garden is open free to the public every Friday, Saturday and Sunday evening from 6 pm until 11 pm through October 10.
