JULIE HOLTZMAN

Miss Julie Holtzman is a Canadian now living in New York. She has played internationally in recital and with orchestra, including a recent orchestral performance of Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue at Carnegie Hall; on radio and television; and on record for CBC International in Canada. Miss Holtzman is a graduate of The Juilliard School where she studied with Rosina Llevinne, and has most recently been coaching with Dorothy Taubman.

In 1970, Miss Holtzman gave the world premiere of the unpublished Concerto, Op. 14 by Franz Xaver Mozart (to which she has exclusive performing rights) with the English Sinfonia in London at Queen Elizabeth Hall, and in 1974, the American premiere with Lukas Foss and The Brooklyn Philharmonia. Miss Holtzman's biography appears in the International Who's Who of Musicians and the World Who's Who of Women 1976.
