NEW SEASON OF <u>RECENT FILMS FROM WEST GERMANY</u> BEGINS NOVEMBER 4 AT THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

In 1972, the Museum introduced to the United States <u>Das Neue Kino</u>, a loose amalgam of stylistically innovative and socially engaged young filmmakers from the Federal Republic of Germany. In the years following, as such directors as Fassbinder, Herzog, and Wenders have gained critical and popular support, the Museum has continued to chart the growth and evolution of this independent-spirited, still-maverick movement. Last year's survey of <u>Das Neue Kino</u> included the U.S. premiere of Fassbinder's <u>Alexanderplatz Berlin</u>. This year's RECENT FILMS FROM WEST GERMANY, the sixth since 1972, will present 18 films that are inventive, challenging, surprising, and controversial. All screenings are held in the Museum's Roy and Niuta Titus Theater 2.

The season opens with <u>Krieg und Frieden</u> (<u>War and Peace</u>), a semifictional, semi-documentary anthology film directed by Volker Schlöndorff, Alexander Kluge, Stefan Aust, and Axel Engstfeld, with screenplays for the fictional episodes written by Nobel Prize winner Heinrich Böll. A Teleculture release in the U.S., <u>War and Peace</u> is a film project distinctive to <u>Das Neue Kino</u>: a collaborative work about a current political situation, in this case the deployment of nuclear missiles in West Germany, presented in a manner that is by turns frightening, witty, and informative.

Among the other films to be shown are new works by Peter Lilienthal (<u>David</u>) and Percy Adlon (<u>Celeste</u>); realistic dramas by Jörge Graser, Tankred Dorst, and the team of Walter Bockmayer and Rolf Bührmann; adventurous, non-narrative films by Friederike Pezold and Hellmuth Costard/Jürgen Ebert; religious burlesque by Herbert Achternbusch, and punk outrage by Muscha and Trini Trimpop.

The Museum will also present repeat screenings of two works that played in this year's New York Film Festival: <u>Rote Liebe</u> (<u>Red Love</u>), directed by Rosa von Praunheim, and <u>Camilla Horn...</u>, by Hans Sachs and Hedda Rinneberg.

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RECENT FILMS FROM WEST GERMANY is presented in conjunction with the Export-Union des Deutschen Films, Munich, and the Federal German Film Board, New York, and with the assistance of Goethe Haus, New York. Selections were made by Larry Kardish, Associate Curator, and Adrienne Mancia, Curator, of the Department of Film. The Museum's film program is made possible with public funds from the New York State Council on the Arts and by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.
