

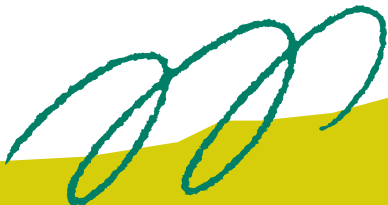
# School visits: Explore through art

Your MoMA tour will be led by one of our dynamic Learning Specialists. They expertly craft and facilitate engaging school visits that focus on the power of art and artists to effect individual and social transformation.

Once your trip is booked, a MoMA Learning Specialist will contact you to discuss your goals and incorporate feedback as they plan your visit.

During a guided visit, you'll dive deep into three to four captivating works of art, engage in close-looking, and participate in vibrant facilitated conversations.





# Nurturing curiosity



MoMA Learning Specialists craft interactive experiences that spark curiosity and excitement. We encourage young learners to ask questions, explore bold ideas, and uncover answers through active teaching methods, hands-on art making, and lively interactive activities.

By asking open ended questions—known as inquiry-based teaching—we foster curiosity, engagement, and deeper understanding. MoMA Learning Specialists go beyond presenting information. They inspire students to uncover knowledge on their own, encouraging critical thinking and problem-solving.

# MoMA themes

We explore works of art through broad themes that connect across MoMA's collection. These themes serve as entry points for your students, fostering conversation and linking classroom learning to broader contexts.





# Kindergarten–5th Grade

## **Investigating Abstraction**

Explore how artists use line, shape, and color to create abstract art.

## **Characters**

Explore how artists depict figures and search for visual and situational clues that can help you understand others' feelings and perspectives.

## **Spaces and Places**

Investigate how artists depict places in their art.

## **Everyday Objects**

Take a closer look at how artists use, depict or transform ordinary objects in artwork.

## **Museums and Collecting: How MoMA Works**

Get a behind-the-scenes look at how MoMA operates and the decisions behind what we see and experience in the galleries.

# 6th–12th Grade

## **Materials and Process**

Learn how different art materials and techniques create various visual effects and explore new ways artists use them.

## **Art and Society**

Delve into artworks by considering their historical and cultural context, exploring diverse viewpoints, and reflecting on your own ideas and perspectives.

## **Identity**

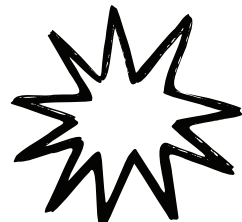
Explore the different ways identity can be portrayed in art, encompassing community, personal connections, and self-expression.

## **Narrative in Art**

Uncover the storytelling, language, symbolism, and poetry found in art, or discover how literature and text influence art and vice versa!

## **Critique the Museum**

What makes up MoMA's collection? What art should be here? What is missing? Understand the influence of the Museum's choices on visitor experiences and consider what you would do.
